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School Council Elections Announcement and Call for Nominations

The Marong Primary School Council election process has now commenced. Marong Primary School Council is calling for nominations for **4 parent member positions** available on our school council. Parents/carers are encouraged to nominate for a position.

Membership Category - Parent/carer representative

Number of Positions Available - 4

Length of term - March 2026 to March 2028

Nominations close - 4pm 16th March 2026

If the number of nominations is less than the number of vacancies, a notice to that effect calling for further nominations will be posted in a prominent position at the school and communicated via Sentral.

How can I nominate? You can nominate through completing a nomination form and returning to the school office by 4pm Monday 16th March. Nomination forms are available from the office.

What do you need to do to stand for election? Parent members are required to hold a valid Working with Children Clearance (WWCC) to nominate for a position on school council. The only exception to this requirement is parents who are also teachers and currently hold VIT registration.

How do I get a Working with Children Clearance, and does it cost money? You can apply for a Working with Children Check (WWCC) through the Services Victoria website. School council members are volunteers which means that applying for a WWCC is free.

When applying for a WWCC, parents must:

- nominate the Department of Education as the organisation they are working for when applying for a Working with Children Check
- provide evidence of their Working with Children Clearance as soon as practicable after receiving it (or via the school council nomination form).

We have scheduled to undertake our NAPLAN assessments for grade 3 and 5 students, during Wednesday 11th – Friday 13th March. Families wanting to know more about NAPLAN can visit the following website. <https://www.nap.edu.au/naplan>

Students will require the use of headphones during their online assessments. The school has provision for this however if students would prefer to bring their own headphones to use, this will be allowed.

GRADE PREP

What we achieved this week!

Wow! Our first full week for the Preps! We are so proud of how hard they have worked this week. They have done an amazing job settling into their full week of school and are showing wonderful effort in their learning. A well-deserved rest this weekend!

In Sounds-Write this week we began Unit 3, focusing on the sounds b, c, g and h. Students practised word building, sound swapping, and letter formation, using focus words such as *sat*, *cat*, *mat*, and *bag*. It has been fantastic to see their confidence growing as they build and read new words.

In Writing, we explored the nursery rhyme song Old McDonald Had a Farm. The students did an awesome job identifying the setting and characters in the song. They also had a go at retelling what happens in the rhyme and attempting to write their own sentences about it. In Mathematics, we have been learning about the days of the week and sequencing different parts of our day. The students enjoyed completing cut-and-paste activities and playing mix-and-match games to help them understand the order of events throughout the day.

GRADE 1/2

What we achieved this week!

This week in reading and writing we have been looking at the fable 'The Owl and the Grasshopper'. In the beginning of the week, we looked at retelling the story in our own words. Later in the week we looked at creating sentences including a noun and an adjective to describe what happens in the story. On Friday it was 'Free Write Friday'. The students came up with many great things to write about, and we seen many great things produced.

In Maths this week we looked at adding and subtracting using different strategies. Early in the week we looked at doubling numbers, solving subtraction problems using related addition facts and adding by bridging through tens. Lots of great mathematicians this week!

We have finally started our super exciting inventions project this week in Integrated. This week we brainstormed some super cool things we might like to create. We design and drafted our ideas, making sure our invention is being created to solve a problem.

- * In the next coming weeks we will begin creating our inventions for Integrated. If you have boxes, egg cartons, bottle top lids etc please keep them around for when we begin crafting!



GRADE 3/4

What we achieved this week!

We have finished week six and learnt lots of tricks!

This week we have...

Reading- we have been working on our comprehension. Being able to respond to texts by answering direct and indirect questions about the content of our book. We are fully engrossed in our novel. Ask your students at home what is happening in our class novel *Kensuke's Kingdom*.

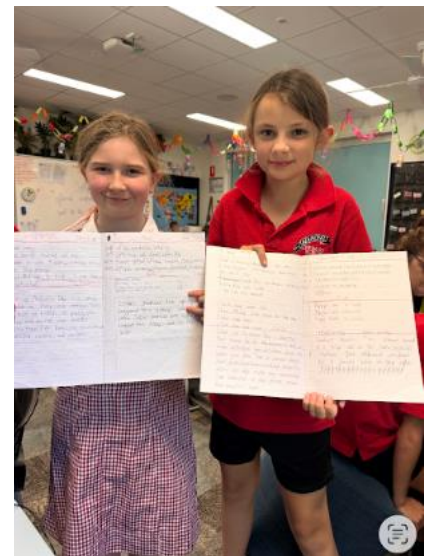
Math- continuing time this week, we have all used clocks to build different sets of time. The students are working on different levels, building from o'clock times up to international time zones.

Writing- we are preparing for NAPLAN by writing narratives. Students have written fictional stories about emergencies as explorer's adventures.

Integrated studies – We have been working on our exploring unit, going on an animal hunt trying to spy as many as we can. We are more than halfway through our class novel. We are all loving *Kensuke's Kingdom* and are all really engaged in the story. We look forward to watching the movie at the end of the term.

Wellbeing- We are continuing working on our wellbeing toolkit this week building positive affirmations, breathing exercises and brain breaks.

ICT- we are discussing the balance of screen time this week. It's all about how much tech we are using and how it can affect our lives both positively and negatively.

GRADE 5/6

What we achieved this week!

This week in Literacy, students have been exploring 2- and 3-syllable words containing the /er/ sound and practising identifying and using them in their writing. We have also continued developing persuasive writing skills, focusing on techniques such as emotive language, strong arguments and clear reasoning to make our writing more convincing. Students have been working on reading comprehension activities to support understanding and prepare for NAPLAN testing next week.

In Mathematics, students focused on clocks and elapsed time, practising reading timetables and calculating time intervals.

In Integrated Studies, students continued exploring political parties. This week we focused on campaigning, with students preparing ideas and strategies for our upcoming 5/6 group election. Activities included creating posters, slogans and key messages to communicate the values and goals of their parties.

- NAPLAN testing for Grade 5 students takes place next week—encourage your child to get a good night's sleep and eat well.

Hand out raffle tickets to the walkers and wheelers as they arrive at school and present a prize at the assembly.

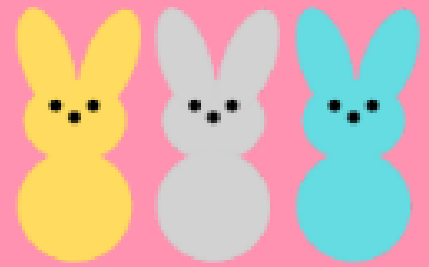
HandsUp! count
