School Council Elections Announcement and Call for Nominations

The Marong Primary School Council election process has now commenced. Marong Primary School Council is calling for nominations for **4 parent member positions** available on our school council. Parents/carers are encouraged to nominate for a position.

Membership Category - Parent/carer representative

Number of Positions Available - 4

Length of term - March 2026 to March 2028

Nominations close - 4pm 16th March 2026

If the number of nominations is less than the number of vacancies, a notice to that effect calling for further nominations will be posted in a prominent position at the school and communicated via Sentral.

How can I nominate? You can nominate through completing a nomination form and returning to the school office by 4pm Monday 16th March. Nomination forms are available from the office.

What do you need to do to stand for election? Parent members are required to hold a valid Working with Children Clearance (WWCC) to nominate for a position on school council. The only exception to this requirement is parents who are also teachers and currently hold VIT registration.

How do I get a Working with Children Clearance, and does it cost money? You can apply for a Working with Children Check (WWCC) through the Services Victoria website. School council members are volunteers which means that applying for a WWCC is free.

When applying for a WWCC, parents must:

- nominate the Department of Education as the organisation they are working for when applying for a Working with Children Check
- provide evidence of their Working with Children Clearance as soon as practicable after receiving it (or via the school council nomination form).

GRADE PREP

What we achieved this week!

What a fantastic Week 7 it has been! It's been a busy week full of learning, exploring and creating!

In Sounds Write, we completed Unit 3, focusing on the sounds b, c, g, and h. The students practised building and reading words, explored swapping sounds to make new words, and had a go at dictation. Their enthusiasm and effort with the activities was fantastic!

In Writing, we continued learning about verbs and nouns. Using a picture prompt of a playground, students were inspired to create some wonderful sentences. We were impressed with the amazing tracing and the creativity shown in their writing this week.

In Mathematics, we explored number bonds to 5. Using a range of hands-on manipulatives, including unifix blocks, counters, fingers and whiteboards, students discovered different ways to combine numbers to make 5. Their curiosity and problem-solving skills were on full display!

GRADE 1/2

What we achieved this week!

It's been another busy but very quick week in Grade 1/2! In Sounds Write, our Grade 1 students have been learning about the /ea/ spelling, which can make the 'ae' and 'ee' sounds. Our Grade 2 students have been focusing on the /ue/ sound and exploring the different spellings 'ue', 'ew', 'u', and 'u-e'.

In Writing this week, we explored the story *The Dog and the Bone*. Students practised expanding their sentences by adding prepositions to show when and where things happened.

In Mathematics, we focused on subtraction using a range of strategies, including ten frames, base-ten blocks, and the split strategy.

Our Integrated unit is becoming very exciting as we get closer to creating our inventions! This week, students worked on writing persuasive pieces to help sell and promote their inventions. We can't wait to begin building them next week.

GRADE 3/4

What we achieved this week!

We have finished week seven, NAPLAN is over and we feel like we're in heaven!

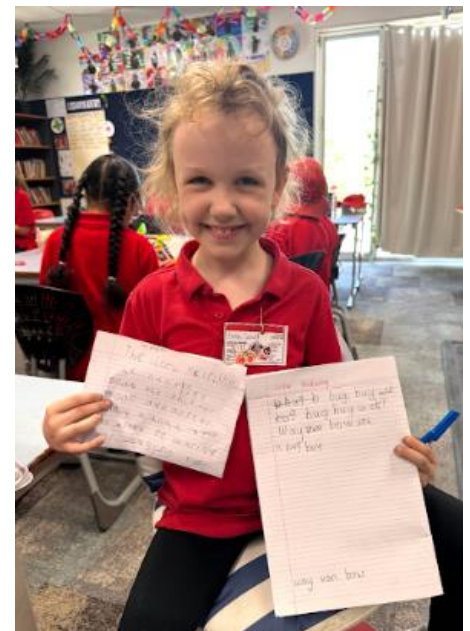
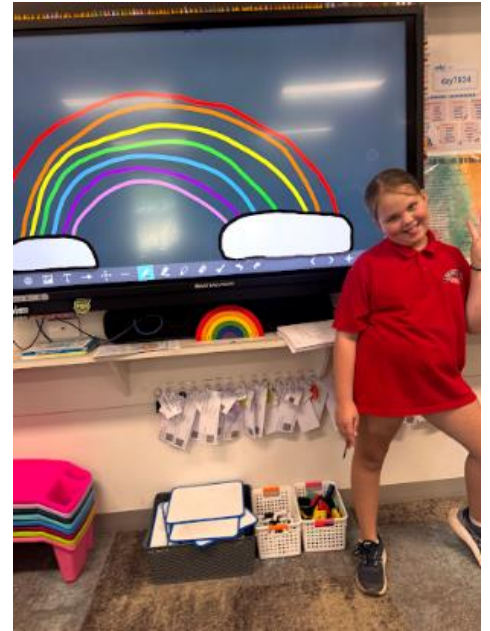
This week we have...

Completed 4 lots of NAPLAN testing, Writing, Reading, Language conventions, and Numeracy. We are so proud of our grade threes and the humungous effort they have put into completing their assessments this week, we were so happy with their attitudes and willingness to participate and try their best.

Reading- we have got our epic class codes up and running meaning students can read online as well as in books. This gives us access to more content and topics to increase our engagement. You can also use this at home as well if you contact your classroom teacher for the codes.

Math- we have been focusing on multiplication and division this week and will be working on memorising times table facts. This is something you could help with at home by practising in the car or while you're on a walk. It takes a lot of practises to remember all the 12x12 facts and is something our students will hopefully build over time.

Writing- students have been writing letters to their friends, typing up stories, and playing written categories by listing the alphabet with themes.

This week was NAPLAN week for our Grade 5 students. They completed assessments in Writing, Reading, Language Conventions and Numeracy. The students approached the tests with a positive attitude and showed great persistence throughout the week. We are very proud of the effort they put in and the way they gave their all. Well done to our Grade 5s for their focus and determination.

While the Grade 5 students were completing NAPLAN, our Grade 6 students worked on writing activities based on narratives, continuing to develop their ideas, characters and story structure. In Mathematics, they also spent time revisiting numeracy concepts that have been taught throughout the term, helping to consolidate their understanding and strengthen their problem-solving skills.

Hand out raffle tickets to the walkers and wheelers as they arrive at school and present a prize at the assembly.

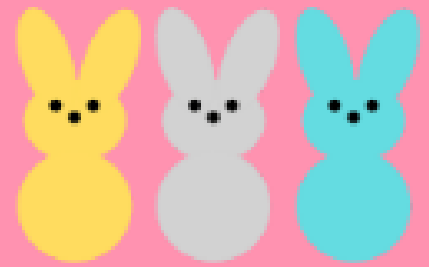
HandsUp! count
