Dear Parents/Caregivers, School Health Policies

As we are at the early beginnings of a new school year I wish to take this opportunity to remind parents and care givers of some very important Student Health policies and procedures.

No Food Share Policy

It is our policy that students do not share their food with other students. This policy is designed to reduce the risk of students with food allergies eating food that may cause them to have a serious reaction such as an Anaphylactic reaction. We have a number of students who have food allergies particularly to nut products. In addition to requesting that food is not shared we also encourage all families to be discerning in choosing food items to send to school with their child. Where possible it is appreciated if you avoid products containing nuts. For parents of children with allergies to food items, bee stings etc it is important that we are provided with an appropriate action plan. If you are unsure as to what we actually require please contact our office.

Medication

At times it is necessary for the school to administer medication to students. In these circumstances we need documentation re dosage levels ,times to be taken and a signed permission form from home. Under no circumstances should a students be taking medication at school with out supervision.

Sun smart

Hats are essential during Terms one, early term 2 and all of term 4. This applies to times when students are outside such as at lunchtime and recess or during outdoor activity times.

Headlice

From time to time we experience outbreaks of Head Lice at our school. To try and minimise the issue the Department of Education requests the following of parents and or care givers. If your child is identified as having Head Lice we request that treatment be applied as soon as possible after the identification has occurred. Once treatment has been applied students may return to school. However please note students cannot return to school until treatment has been administered. Consult your local pharmacist for advice on suitable products to use. Als if you locate headlice n your child hair please notify the school so that we can advise the community that head lice are present. In these instances the information provided is treated confidentially.








Grade 2/3!




Grade 4/5/6!

The grade 4/5/6's have been busy and have settled back into the swing of things. For our literacy block we have focused on different genres of books and classifying them into specific categories. For example, looking at fiction and non-fiction books and characteristics of specific books. The writing has looked at creating a narrative pieces and being able to edit them and improve our writing. For this, the 4/5/6's have been using a rubric and giving feedback to their peers on how they can improve.

Numeracy this week has continued with place value and we have been begun and looking at rounding and estimation. This has been looking at rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000+. The other has been focusing on 2D and 3D shapes are their characteristics. Integrated has seen us researching and understanding rules and laws and the different levels of Government. We have even looked into some rules and laws we abide and even some older laws in other countries that still exist.

As the new school year commences, I wanted to take this opportunity to remind parents and guardians that support is available for students and families through my role as school Chaplain and Student Wellbeing Officer.

The role includes but is not limited to:

- · Supporting student attendance, engagement and mental health
- · Supporting students in difficult or challenging situations such as during times of grief
- · Providing students with referrals to specialist services when required
- · Providing pastoral care and guidance to students about values and ethical matters
- · Supporting physical, emotional, social and intellectual development and wellbeing of students
- · Supporting an environment of cooperation and respecting a diversity of cultures and traditions.

This support also extends to students' families and is not limited to school related issues. All conversations are treated in a private and confidential manner. Please note that the conversations and support are not religious in nature and are provided in a friendly, non-judgement and safe environment.

I have taken on this role at Marong Primary School after spending over 25 years working in Community Services; with approximately 10 years working with At Risk Youth and youth experiencing significant mental heath issues. My experience includes supporting people with a disability, coordinating youth mentoring programs, working with and supporting individuals and families access vital services and obtain access to stable housing, income support, education, vocational training and a range of allied health services.
