#### Successful grant Application

I am pleased to inform our community that we have been advised that a grant for \$25000 has been awarded to our school to provide for 30 new Ipads for use in the junior section of the school. In addition a portion of the grant will be used to develop an area between our OSHC room and the art room for use as an outdoor learning space. This grant has been funded via the Federal Government under the Schools Upgrade Funding program.

#### Grade Prep/One

Week 2 has been very busy indeed and we are certainly back into the full swing of things. In reading this week we introduced the first of the reading strategies to our Preps. The reading strategy



Eagle Eye reminds beginning readers to think, 'what is in the picture that starts with the beginning letter'. Our Grade One students were very helpful when modelling and introducing this strategy which wonderful to see. In maths, we explored place value through the use of tens frames and MAB blocks and the Grade Ones focused on place value and partitioning, eg 346 = 300 + 40 + 6.

We loved watching our students implement their phonics knowledge in writing when decoding CVC words and then putting them into sentences. Our students have also been busy training for athletics which is on Thursday 11th May. Thank you all for another wonderful week.

#### **Grade 2/3!**

It's been a busy week for the grade 2/3's this week!

This week we have continued our work with procedures, looking at how to make slime and writing our own recipes. In reading we have been practicing our reading strategies like flippy dolphin, stretchy snake, chunky monkey and eagle eye.

After our hard work on multiplication last week, we have now



turned our attention to division. We have explored how to share equally and what happens when a number cannot be shared equally. Students have looked at a map of Australia, locating the states and territories. We have completed a mini research project on one of the states, investigating its population, state flag, state emblems and interesting facts.

It was great to see a bit of sunshine earlier in the week, giving us an opportunity to trin for the upcoming athletics carnival next week. We had a go at some discus, shot put, hurdles and long jump. Our house leaders did a fantastic job showing us the techniques to help us throw, jump and run the little bit further and faster.

#### Grade 4/5/6!

Another great week from us in 4/5/6!

Reading: This week the 4/5/6's have been focusing on the author's writing and analysing characters description, speech and actions. Using the writer's choice of language as evidence.

Writing: The aim of our writing this week has been around our narratives and using our checklists to bump up our writing. We have been focusing on specific areas and our goals to make an impact in our stories.

Math: We have been working on telling time to the

minute using analogue, digital and 24-hour time. Students have solving and then converting between the three. The other lessons this week we have been learning about BODMAS and how to solve equations with multiple operations.




A big congratulations to everyone in the 4/5/6's who ran in the cross country and Bendigo racecourse on Wednesday, they all represented the school extremely well.
