Whole School professional Practice Day

Following approval from our school council I wish to confirm that Marong Primary School will be closed on Monday October 9th 2023 as all staff will be participating in a PP day. Outside school hours care will be available on this day for those who require all day care. Bookings essential as there is a limit to the number of children we can cater for in this program.

Mobile Phone Policy

All Department of Education schools in the state of Victoria are required to have a Mobile Phone Policy. The following is an extract from our policy: Where students bring a mobile phone to school, Marong Primary school will provide secure storage. Secure storage is storage that cannot be readily accessed by those without permission to do so. At Marong Primary school students are required to hand their phones to their classroom teacher in the morning. Alternatively they can be left at the main office to be placed in a lockable cupboard. It is essential that students comply with this policy and our school expectations. Our Mobile Phone Policy is available on our school website.

Early Arrivals

We are noticing that a number of students are being dropped off at school at times when supervision is not provided. I wish to remind parents and guardians that supervision commences at 8:45am each day. Before School Care is available from 7am and concludes at 8.45am.

Gymnastics

A school permission form will need to be signed for students to participate in our gym program. To avoid confusion between the swimming note and gym notes we will send the Gymnastics notes home next week. Transport will be by bus. Please note students need to dress in shorts or track pants and school shirt. Shoes and socks are removed whilst at the gym so it is preferable for students to have footwear that they can readily take off and put back on with minimal assistance if required. Jewellery is not permitted for safety reasons. Students with pierced ears need to remove earrings or sleepers. If this is difficult tape can be used to provide protection. The cost for this program including transport is \$30 per student. Once again a subsidy has been applied to reduce costs to parents.
