NAPLAN 2025 results

Students who participated in NAPLAN 2025 received their results last week. Our school has received some very pleasing results. Some highlights worth noting are as follows. Our school's average of students in Year 5 Reading and Numeracy achieving at or above expected level were above the state average as well as the average of similar schools and schools within our network.

Our Year 3 students achieving at or above expected level in Number were above the averages of the state, and similar and network schools and on par with similar and network schools when compared in Reading. A great overall result for such a dedicated group of students and teachers. I am very proud!

Grade 2/3

Literacy

This week, students continued exploring Finding Our Heart by Thomas Mayo. As part of their reading, they examined the AIATSIS Map of Indigenous Australia, learning about the different language groups and the areas they represent. A key discussion question was: How do the illustrations add meaning to the story and help us learn more about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, their culture, and experiences? In writing, students focused on identifying and correcting run-on sentences. They also planned the personal response paragraph for their book reports, using a mentor text to understand its purpose, structure, and key features.

Mathematics

In maths, students continued learning to represent multiplication and division in different ways, with a focus on solving division problems using partitioning. Warm-up activities included Dodging Tables – (tables from 6 to 11), and students also enjoyed solving an Esti-Mystery challenge to build their reasoning and estimation skills.

Integrated Studies

Our integrated studies focus this term is Making the Australian Constitution. This week, students began learning about important Australians who played a key role in shaping our nation. As part of this, they created trading cards featuring a significant figure, including a drawing, their name, and their "special power" – what they are known for and how they contributed to Australia's history.




