It has been noted that some parents are not using designated car parking spaces when collecting their children after school. Grade Prep & 1

We started the week with our Book Day celebrations and it was wonderful to see everyone dressed up as their favourite book characters. The students enjoyed reading stories together and taking part in some fun arts and crafts activities to celebrate our love of reading.

On Wednesday morning, we were lucky to have a STEM incursion. The students were amazed by a performance filled with clever illusions and tricks that were all based on STEM concepts. It was such a fun and engaging way to explore science, technology, engineering, and maths in action!

Back in the classroom, in Maths we have been revising 2D and 3D shapes, as well as location and direction. The students have enjoyed hands-on activities to build their understanding of these concepts.

In Writing, we investigated our sense of smell. The students had lots of fun smelling and describing different scents such as peppermint, coffee, vanilla, and vinegar. There were many different opinions about which smells were "good" or "bad" and it made for some great discussion!

In Sounds-Write, the Grade 1s have been exploring the oo spelling and the different sounds it can represent, while the Preps were introduced to the sh digraph. Both groups have been busy building words and using them in sentences.

Grade 2/3

Wow – what a wonderful week it has been at school! We kicked things off with Book Week celebrations on Monday, where the excitement and joy of reading filled our classrooms. Book Week is always a highlight, giving students the chance to immerse themselves in stories, discover new authors, and share their love of reading with friends and teachers.

Midweek, students were treated to a STEM incursion on Wednesday, where circus-like tricks sparked curiosity and wonder, leaving everyone asking, "How did that happen?"

In Literacy, students enjoyed Readers Theatre, performing plays such as Hansel and Gretel, The Treasure Map, and





Dog Park Days. This gave them the opportunity to practise reading clearly, using expression, showing confidence, and listening respectfully. In Writing, we explored personal response paragraphs, identifying topic sentences, supporting details, and concluding sentences. Meanwhile in Mathematics, students investigated geometry, describing 2D shapes, identifying polygons, and recognising similarities and differences in 3D objects.

It has been a busy, exciting week, and we are so proud of the way students embraced every learning opportunity with enthusiasm. This week in rotations, students took part in Balloon Games that encouraged teamwork, cooperation, and lots of laughter. Through these activities, they practised respectful communication, sharing fairly, showing self-control, and staying positive even when things didn't go their way.

MARONG PS OSHC WELCOMES NEW EDUCATOR ALANA


As with changes to staffing over the past week




