#### **Curriculum Day**

Friday, October 7<sup>th</sup> has been set aside as a Curriculum day for staff. On this day staff will work with Andrea Hillbrick (Educational Consultant) on the development of effective teaching practice in Mathematics. This day will be a pupil free day.

#### Melbourne Cup Hat Parade Its Back!

On Tuesday, November 2<sup>nd</sup> we will hold our Melbourne Cup Hat Parade. Students are invited to wear a theme based hat on the day. They can create their own or wear something that they have at home. There will be different categories for students to enter into. A panel of judges will be present on the day to judge the winning hats from each category. Please see examples of the categories below.

#### SunSmart School

As we are now in fourth term all students are required to wear a hat whilst outdoors. SunSmart policy advises that when the UV index reaches three, we need to actively protect our skin from the sun by putting on protective clothing, using sunscreen and seeking out shade.

Students will need to have a hat available to them at school at all times. Hats need to be clearly named and may remain in lockers at school to prevent them from being left at home. As the weather becomes hotter/sunnier, students who do not have access to a hat will be asked to remain in shaded areas during time outdoors.



#### Thunderstorm Asthma

There is an increased risk of seasonal asthma, hay fever and epidemic thunderstorm asthma during seasons with increased grass pollen levels. This typically occurs between October and December.

<u>Epidemic thunderstorm asthma</u> events are triggered by a combination of higher grass pollen levels and a certain type of thunderstorm. People with a history of asthma, undiagnosed asthma or hay fever are at an increased risk under these conditions.

This risk is increased further for people who have poorly treated hay fever and asthma.

The best way to reduce and prevent symptoms of asthma or hay fever and reduce unnecessary absences from school is to follow an up-to-date asthma action plan or hay fever treatment plan, provided by a general practitioner (GP) or specialist.

#### **Grade Prep**

How lovely it has been to see all our beautiful students skip through the door and ready to start term four with a bang. We had our last gym session this week where the students thoroughly enjoyed balancing, rolling, jumping and tumbling! Writing this week was all about correct sentence structure and the four key aspects of a sentence. The kids blew us away with their writing abilities and independence. In maths we revised matching numerals to number names as well as sequencing duration of events such as morning noon and night. In smart spelling we focused on the 'or' digraph such as in the word 'fork.' Our sentence of the week was 'Can you bring a fork from the bench?' We look forward to seeing all students back in the classroom on Monday due to tomorrow's Curriculum Day.




